


Bus Route and Schedule of Fares: Approved







Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your request for information concerning probable cost of construction of swimming pool and bath house for the Colored population of Ottawa, I wish to submit the following information.

1. Data furnished by Mr. Harper--City Engineer at Salina Kansas--Bond issue was approved by voters in last years election to enlarge and improve city's recreational facilities. A tract of land was obtained to develop as a park for the Colored population. Recreation Center Building with bath house facilities was provided by purchase of Army surplus building and subsequent remodeling. A contract was recently let for \$25,500 for 40 ft. by 60 ft. pool--3 ft. to 10 ft. deep, with filter house and operating equipment. Salina's Colored population estimated at 1000 with 70 children in school. The City of Salina expects the pool to be municipally operated at a loss when completed. Mr. Harper estimates cost of pool plus bath house facilities at \$40,000 to \$45,000.

2. Data furnished by the City Engineer at Manhattan, Kansas. Estimated pool for Colored population built in 1938 as W.P.A. project. Estimated dimensions at 20ft. by 60ft.--2ft. to 9ft. deep, 50,000 gal. capacity with small bath house facilities and wading pool located in the city park. Pool was designed by Mr. Wolfenbarger, architect of Manhattan, Kansas. Estimated cost of construction facilities today --- \$45,000 to \$50,000. Pool was reported to be operated by the city from Park Department funds. Colored Population - 400-500

My estimate of cost, based on this information, of a pool 40ft. by 60ft. with bath house and toilet facilities is \$35,000.

A careful study should be made of financing, operation and maintenance, personnel problems, lease agreements etc. before making a decision to proceed on this proposed project. A questionnaire sent by the city clerks to such cities as Leawards, Parsons, Fort Scott and Manhattan have had experience in operating pools for the Colored population would undoubtedly obtain some valuable information.

If such pool were to be located in Forest Park it would have to be east of the existing pool or north of the Main Gate along Locust Street in order to have sanitary sewer facilities. In the event that you decide to submit this proposal to the voters in the spring election a more careful and detailed estimate of cost based on the dimensions and location of the pool and other facilities actually proposed will be necessary.
