



Bids Opened-New Truck-W & L Dept.





Recommendation-City Engineer-Land For Drainage Control



Discussion: Rual Water District No. 2



Street Network- New High School Area



City Offices Closed - December 24 and December 31, 1965


The Governing Body authorized the closing of City Offices on December 24 and 31, due to Christmas and New Years day falling on Saturday, a normal day off for employees.


Information Meeting - STAG Unit




